#### Staff Parish Relations Adds a New **Staff Position**

#### **New Safety Ministry Action Team Establishes Protocols**

Over the past year or so, several First -Faith members have participated in training events to help promote a safe environment for those who gather at our church building. Previous training included "Stop the Bleed" and "Active Shooter" as well as some overall, general safety training.

Subsequently, a new Safety Ministry Action Team has been formed and is led by our Head Usher, Clyde Church. Ten other men serve with Clyde on this team: Terry Sheen, Bob Trosper, Mike Welsh, Floyd Sorensen, Jerry Bland, Alan Hess, Stephen Hayes, Ken Ross, Bruce Kleint, and Duane Johnson.

These men serve on a rotation basis, and provide an extra level of security alertness during our worship services. If you would like to be a part of this team, please speak with Clyde.

Another safety protocol soon to go into effect is the locking of the front doors 24/7. All ministry leaders are

encouraged to have a greeter at the door prior to their ministry event and to provide all participants with their cell phone number in case someone arrives late and needs to be let into the building.

Persons visiting the church during office hours should plan to use the doorbell on the south side of the entranceway. This creates a visual display in the office and provides twoway audio communication with guests. While the team believes most will agree that we live in such times requiring prudent measures, we apologize in advance for any inconvenience this may cause.

### **Church Council Initiates Survey to Determine Congregations' Standing** on LGBTQ Inclusion.

On January 15th, every household was mailed a survey calling for prayerful responses to questions currently facing our denomination concerning the ordination of gay and lesbian persons and the ability to officiate samesex marriages.

Households with persons aged 12 and above, should have received one survey form for each member to complete and return. Everyone's voice matters and this was a way that Council felt everyone could be heard.

If you have not had an opportunity to complete and return your survey, please do so immediately so that a summary report can be prepared in time for the next Council meeting on Feb. 10.



### WORSHIP AND OTHER GATHERING HIGHLIGHTS

On the first three Sundays of February, we'll take a look at the first portion of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. We'll explore how Jesus turns things upside down, inviting us to see God's Kingdom in ways that were, and still are, countercultural.

**2/2** - Pastor Trudy guides us through the Beatitudes in Matthew 5:1-12, the opening words of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, as we hear who are favored, or blessed, in God's sight. The Chancel Choir will sing and we will celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion.

**2/9** - On this *Scouting Sunday*, our worship is focused on Matt. 5:13-20, the second of the Sermon on the Mount mini-series. Pastor Trudy's message, "Lampstands and Salt Shakers," helps us understand how these metaphors are essential for Christian living.

**2/16** - This Sunday's worship concludes the Sermon on the Mount series with a focus on our thoughts and emotions. Pastor Trudy preaches on Matthew 5:21-37 with this new look at old laws. The Chancel Choir leads us in singing and the *Children's Noisy Can Offering* will again go toward supporting Camp Fontanelle.



**2/23** - The Season of Epiphany comes to an end as we gather on this **Transfiguration Sunday.** Pastor Trudy's message, based on Matthew 17:1-9, shares how this event serves as a peek at things to come; and how, like the disciples of so long ago, God commands us to listen to Jesus now. The Bell Choir will share their anthem.



The Season of Lent begins with **Ash Wednesday**, which falls on **February 26th** this year. The word "Lent" comes from the Anglo-Saxon word *lencten*, which means "spring." The season of Lent is to be a time of preparation for Easter and is historically a time for fasting. Christians are encouraged to enter a time of self-reflection on one's mortality and the need for repentance in anticipation of Resurrection. Our **evening service is at 7:00pm** and will include the Imposition of Ashes. Pastor Trudy's message will focus on the importance of forgiveness.

### STUDY & GROW IN GOD'S WORD


Pastor Trudy' Sunday school class continues a study of Introducing the Old Testament written by Dr. Amy-Jill Levine. This study helps participants better understand the Old

and processes God uses to strengthen our faith and develop our character.






