

WORSHIP AND OTHER GATHERING HIGHLIGHTS



We approach the season of Lent with an emphasis on personal investigation, and contrition - the intentional work of seeking a change of heart and action. Reflection and change take hard work. Lent can be like a boot camp for the soul, a restart in a focused area. Join us for this new worship series.

3/1 - On this first Sunday of Lent, Pastor Trudy preaches on Psalm 32 and Matthew 4:1-11, "The Need for Change." Like Jesus, we face temptation as we discern what God really wants for us. The choir will sing and we will celebrate the Lord's Supper.

3/8 - On this second Sunday of Lent, Pastor Trudy's message is "Reset." Genesis 12:1-4a and John 3:1-17 provide the texts as we consider that spiritual rebirth means a new start. No more of the same old same old.

3/15 - This Lenten Sunday, third in our worship series "Boot Camp for the Soul," leads us to consider the need to "Hydrate" our souls. Pastor Trudy's message is based on Exodus 17:1-7 and John 4:5-42, reminding us that living water sustains us on our journey. The Chancel Choir will sing and the Children's Noisy Can collection will go toward Camp Fontanelle's presentation on 3/29.

3/22 - We have entered the second half of the Lenten Season. 1 Samuel 16:1-13 and John 9: 1-41 are our focus texts as Pastor Trudy's sermon "Redefined" teaches us that when Jesus touches us, we, too, are more than we appear to be. What is that? The Bell Choir will ring out their anthem.






STUDY & GROW IN GOD'S WORD

Beginning March 1st, the Fireside Class, led by Larry Coates will begin a study of "The Walk" written by Adam Hamilton. This DVD-based study covers five essential spiritual practices rooted in Jesus' own walk with



God. The sessions include: Worship and Prayers, Study, Service, Giving, and Sharing. This class is open to all interested youth and adults.

Bishop Ruben Saenz Jr. is inviting the people of the Great Plains Conference to join him on a reflective retreat about Jesus' love



and sacrifice during Lent via Facebook, an experience the bishop has titled "By His Side."

Starting Ash Wednesday, Feb. 26, the conference will post a verse and theme for reflection and pose a question via its Facebook page by 5 a.m. each morning. The bishop encourages participants to read the scripture and reflect using the lectio divina process, which has six steps, as shared in the book "Song of the Seed: The Monastic Way of Tending the Soul," by Marcina Wiederkehr:

- 1. **Preparation:** Take time to unclutter our mind and unify our heart with God's heart.
- 2. **Reflective Reading:** This is the first reading of the day's scripture and focus word. Read with the ear of our heart, contemplatively, slowly, and whenever possible, aloud.
- 3. **Contemplation:** This is a time for a patient waiting. It is not a prayer time, but a time to listen for God to speak to us.
- 4. **Meditation:** Read the scripture again. Listen to the text as it speaks.
- Prayer: We can use words to express praise, repentance, thanksgiving, or petition for God's grace and mercy. Be open to how the Spirit may lead you to pray.
- Journaling: Journaling happens at the end of your day. Write down your reflections on both the question and theme of the day. Please share your reflection in some form on the Great Plains Conference Facebook thread.


hear back from disaster coordinators and case workers. They may have work for a day or two, but not the entire week.
